We report greenhouse gas emissions on all existing sites where we have active operations. This includes our manufacturing facility in Arnhem, the Netherlands, our Accoya Color facility in Barry, UK, our London office, and our 60% share of the Joint Venture, Accoya USA, in Kingsport USA. We set our GHG emissions reporting boundaries using the equity share approach. Please see the Accsys Annual Report and Financial Statements 2026 page 46 for further information.

Emissions have been calculated following the GHG Protocol – Corporate Accounting and Reporting (revised edition) using the following databases: IPCC 2006 Guidelines for National Greenhouse Gas Inventories, 2007 IPCC Fourth Assessment Report; and IE A factor s (2022). We also use the UK Government GHG Conversion Factors for Company Reporting (2022). SECR guidance has been followed.

As we have increased production capacity in FY26, overall emissions have increased as expected. Scope 1 emissions have slightly increased but at a slower pace due to efficiency improvements at Arnhem. Scope 2 location-based emissions have decreased, this is due to greater use of renewables on public grids, despite our usage increasing. Scope 2 market-based electricity emissions have increased as a larger share of our electricity is now exposed to the residual mix. Scope 2 steam emissions have increased due to increased production at Kingsport. Scope 3 emissions have increased due to updated Life Cycle Assessment values, increased production volumes, and updated emissions factors.

We don't report on all categories for scope 3 for the following reasons: Category 8 (Upstream leased assets) - Emissions from the operations of facilities leased by Accsys are included in Scope 1 and 2; Category 11 (Use of sold products) - This category is not relevant as our products do not have direct in-use phase emissions associated with their use, in that they do not consume electricity/fuels for their use or release greenhouse gases over their lifetime; Category 13 (Downstream leased assets) - All products that we produce are sold and they do not operate a leasing model, emissions within this category are not relevant; Category 14 (Franchises) - We do not operate franchises and so this category is not relevant for its Scope 3 Carbon footprint; Category 15 (Investments) - We have accounted for our Joint Venture in Scope 1 & 2.
